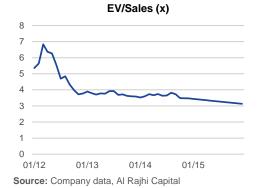

Q3: Mostly in-line, no surprises

Zain KSA's Q3 2014 net loss came in at SAR316mn slightly better than our estimate of SAR335mn, mainly helped by lower provisions. Operating loss at SAR134mn was exactly in line with our expectations. The company is yet to report Q3 revenue. Based on our back calculation from reported EBITDA and EBITDA margin, Q3 revenue seems to have declined 7% y-o-y and 6% q-o-q. This was disappointing after the early signs of improvement seen in the past two quarters. While full details are not disclosed, the company also reported that it did not keep up one of the loan covenants with the financing banks. Though this is not considered as a default as per the Murabaha financing agreement, this along with weak top line growth do not look positive for the company. We await for complete financials to revisit our forecasts for the company. For now, we remain Neutral on Zain KSA with a target price of SAR11 per share.

- Revenue: Revenue was not reported by the company. Based on EBITDA and EBITDA margin provided, we back calculated the Q3 revenue at SAR1.5bn, which implies a 6% q-o-q and a 7% y-o-y decline. This is disappointing given that the company was showing early signs of improvement in the past two quarters. Details about its individual business segments are not reported, but the company seems to be facing a continuing decline in voice subscribers and revenue, given that the number of data subscribers grew by 150% y-o-y.
- **EBITDA**: EBITDA declined by 2% q-o-q, whereas EBITDA margin improved to 17.8% in Q3 2014 from 17 % in the last quarter. The margin increased as it benefited from increase in higher margin data services. The operating loss was reported at SAR134mn, exactly in line with our estimates.
- Net profit: Zain KSA's Q3 2014 net loss came in at SAR316mn slightly better than our estimate of SAR335mn, mainly helped by decrease in provisions. While details are not given, the company also reported an adjustment in useful life of some of the company's assets, which is likely to have reduced depreciation expenses.

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- Loan covenant: The Company reported that it fell short of meeting the targets set in its approved business plan. It also failed to meet one of its loan covenants, which is not considered as an event of default as per Murabaha Financing Agreement. Subsequently, the company management has met with the financing banks to discuss the variations from its business plan and currently is in discussions with the banks to agree on a plan to address these matters.
- Valuation: We await detailed financials to revisit our estimates for Zain KSA. For now, we remain Neutral with a target price of SAR11 per share..

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Additional disclosures

1. Explanation of Al Rajhi Capital's rating system

Al Rajhi Capital uses a three-tier rating system based on absolute upside or downside potential for all stocks under its coverage except financial stocks and those few other companies not compliant with Islamic Shariah law:

"Overweight": Our target price is more than 10% above the current share price, and we expect the share price to reach the target on a 6-9 month time horizon.

"Neutral": We expect the share price to settle at a level between 10% below the current share price and 10% above the current share price on a 6-9 month time horizon.

"Underweight": Our target price is more than 10% below the current share price, and we expect the share price to reach the target on a 6-9 month time horizon.

2. Definitions

"Time horizon": Our analysts make recommendations on a 6-9 month time horizon. In other words, they expect a given stock to reach their target price within that time.

"Fair value": We estimate fair value per share for every stock we cover. This is normally based on widely accepted methods appropriate to the stock or sector under consideration, e.g. DCF (discounted cash flow) or SoTP (sum of the parts) analysis.

"Target price": This may be identical to estimated fair value per share, but is not necessarily the same. There may be very good reasons why a share price is unlikely to reach fair value within our time horizon. In such a case we set a target price which differs from estimated fair value per share, and explain our reasons for doing so.
